Silver Birch Park located on County Road NN 2 ½ miles south of Arkansaw, WI NEW boat ramp & dock. Silver Birch Park is home to the Pepin County Shooting Range which opens April through Gun Season ([click here to go to the web page with information on the gun range](#)). 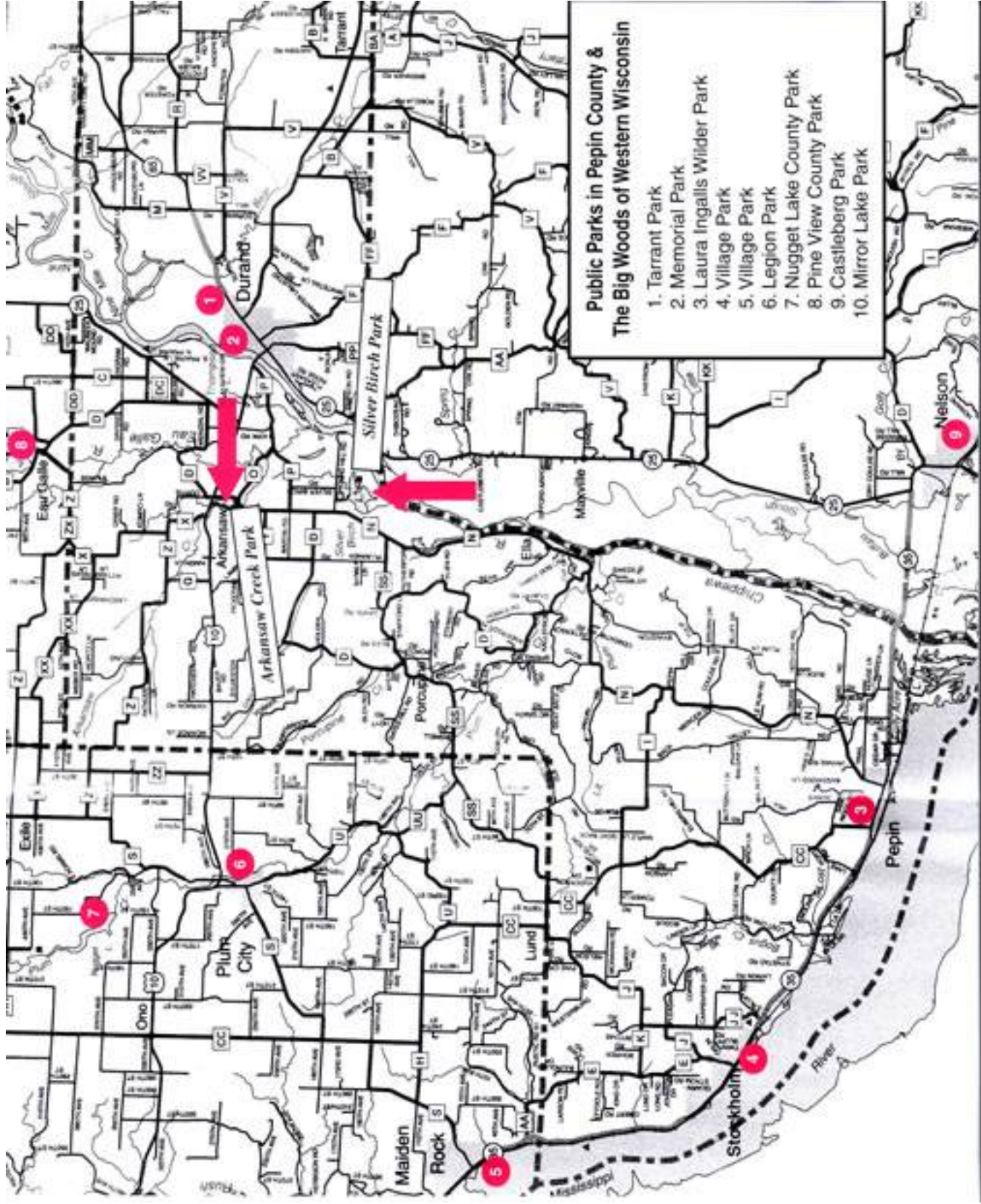
### **Holden Park Campground**

Located off County Road N on SS, 2 ½ miles south of Arkansaw, WI on beautiful Silver Birch Lake. RV/tent electrical hook-ups, 12 sites, toilets, water, dumpster, picnic area and playground. Parks are open April 1st through Thanksgiving. RV/tent sites are available for \$10.00 per night. Camping envelopes available on site. See map below for further directions.

### **Arkansaw Creek Park**

Arkansaw Creek Park follows the sparkling water for a quarter mile as it rushes through the beautiful sandstone dell. This park offers playgrounds, large and small pavilions, amphitheater, horse shoe pits and plenty of parking. A large festival, Arkansaw Creek Park Days, occurs yearly on the third or fourth weekend in June in the park. See map below for location. Arkansaw Creek Park is open year round.
