_____ (Number of Haney tests) The Haney test uses unique soil extracts in the lab to determine what quantity of soil nutrients are available to soil microbes. Reimbursement for up to 6 tests. Cost may vary.

_____ acres \$20/acres (\$2,000 max) New acres of rye or (rye + other seed) interseeded into growing crop or planted after harvest.
