## Valentine's Day Activities for All!

**Create Memory Lane Valentine's Day Cards** - Create custom Valentine's Day cards using familiar photos. Include photos of family, pets, favorite places, or significant events. Talk about why each of the photos is so special. Memory and emotional connection are fostered through familiar photos, bringing comfort and joy.

**Listen to Music and Dance** - Play soft, romantic music, or classic love songs that will be recognized. Encourage singing, dancing, or swaying to the music. Hold hands and enjoy movement together. Music is known to elicit memories, while boosting mood and improving relaxation.

**Craft Simple Valentine's Day Cards** - Use simple craft materials like red and pink construction paper, stickers, and markers for making cards. Encourage card creation for family and friends. Crafting can be therapeutic and provides a fun way to express creativity, even if the final result is simple.

**Enjoy a Heart-Shaped Sensory Activity** - Use materials like soft fabric, textured hearts, or heart-shaped objects (such as foam or wooden hearts) for a tactile activity. Feel and explore these objects. Introduce scented oils or flowers for a multi-sensory experience. Sensory activities can calm anxiety and help people to feel more grounded.

**Bake a Valentine's Day Treat** - Simple baking activities, like making heart-shaped cookies or cupcakes, can be fun. Let your loved one help with the mixing, pouring, or decorating as they're able. Use safe, easy-to-handle materials. The sensory experience of baking—smelling, tasting, and touching—can be very enjoyable and comforting.

**Tell a Story or Read a Poem** - Read short love stories or poems aloud, especially ones that are gentle and familiar. Listening to stories or poems can engage the imagination and create emotional connection.

**Enjoy Old Photographs** - Sit down together and look through a photo album or a memory box, focusing on moments of love, family, and happiness. Reminiscing can spark memories and improve connections.

# Wisconsin Homestead Tax Credit



The homestead tax credit program is designed to soften the impact of property taxes and rent for people who live in Wisconsin. The credit is based on the relationship of your household income to the amount of your property taxes and/or rent paid for the 2025 calendar year.

## Core Eligibility Requirements

To qualify for the 2025 Homestead Credit, you must meet all of the following:

- **Income:** The maximum allowable household income for the credit is \$24,680 a year
- **Residency:** You must have been a legal resident of Wisconsin for the entire year (January 1 through December 31, 2025).
- **Age/Status:** You must be at least 18 years old as of December 31, 2025.
- **Special Condition:** You (or your spouse) must meet at least one of these criteria:
  - Have positive earned income during 2025.
  - Be disabled.
  - Be age 62 or older by the end of 2025.
- **Dependent Status:** You cannot be claimed as a dependent on someone else's 2025 federal income tax return (unless you are 62 or older).
- **Property Taxes:** You must own or rent a Wisconsin home that is subject to Wisconsin property taxes.

## How to Claim

- **Forms:** Use [Schedule H](#) (standard) or [Schedule H-EZ](#) (short form).
- **Required Documents:** Renters must provide an original [2025 Rent Certificate](#) signed by their landlord; homeowners must attach a copy of their 2025 property tax bill.
- **Timeline:** Do **not** file your 2025 claim before January 1, 2026. The deadline for most 2025 claims is April 15, 2030.
- **Free Assistance:** Low-income or elderly residents can often find help at [VITA or TCE tax sites](#) across the state.
- **Benefit Specialists** at the Aging & Disability Resource Center of Buffalo & Pepin Counties are available to assist individuals with their Homestead Credit applications. Please call 1-866-578-2372 or email [adrc-bp@co.pepin.wi.us](mailto:adrc-bp@co.pepin.wi.us) to schedule an appointment.
- **Buffalo County** will also be hosting Homestead Tax Clinics in March. Dates, times, and locations will be determined. Please watch the March newsletter for more details.

**What do you bring to the appointment:** Copies of *all* your income, Social Security number, tax bill or rent certificate, and the total of all your medical care insurance premiums, (for example: Medicare Supplement Insurance Premiums, Medicare Part B premiums, Medicare Part D premiums, Long Term Care premiums (nursing home insurance), Employer Group insurance premiums, etc.).

### Medicare Coverage of Mental Health Treatment

According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, an estimated one in eight older adults (over the age of 60) had a mental illness, and one in 11 had a substance use disorder in the past year. Many factors contribute to a higher risk of mental health concerns in older adults, including new medical diagnoses, life changes, losses of family members and friends, and social isolation. Unfortunately, a significant percentage of older adults who need mental health care are not receiving it. This may be because of stigma, cost, lack of transportation, and challenges navigating the health care system.

Medicare covers screenings and services that treat mental health concerns and substance use disorders. Medicare Part B covers outpatient care, like individual and group therapy, activity therapies like art therapy, partial hospitalization programs, and annual depression screenings. Part B also covers outpatient substance use disorder treatment, including services received at a clinic, hospital outpatient department, or in an opioid treatment program.

When choosing providers for Medicare-covered services, make sure they accept assignment. A provider who accepts the assignment will accept Medicare's approved amount as payment in full for a service and will not charge you anything over that amount. If you see a provider who is not a medical doctor, like a psychologist or clinical social worker, make sure they are Medicare-certified. Medicare will only pay for covered services if the provider is Medicare-certified.

If you have Original Medicare, you will pay a 20% coinsurance for Part B-covered services after you meet your Part B deductible (\$257 in 2025). For most preventive services, including annual depression screenings, you pay nothing. If you are enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, contact your plan for help finding in-network providers and to learn about costs.

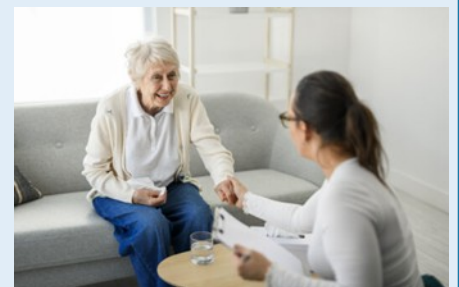
If you need prescription drugs for mental health treatment, your Part D plan or Medicare Advantage plan may cover them. Make sure the drugs you need are on your plan's list of covered drugs, or formulary. Part D plans and Medicare Advantage plans that include drug coverage are required to cover many drugs used to treat mental health conditions. This includes antidepressants, anticonvulsants, and antipsychotic medications.

If you need inpatient mental health services, these may be covered by Medicare Part A. This includes services you receive in a psychiatric hospital or general hospital for inpatient mental illness treatment and inpatient substance use disorder treatment. Part A covers up to 190 days of inpatient care in a psychiatric hospital over a person's lifetime.

If you have used up these 190 days, Part A may cover additional inpatient mental health care in a general hospital. If you are receiving inpatient mental health care in a general hospital, Part A will cover up to 90 days per benefit period. In addition, Part A will pay for up to 60 lifetime reserve days if you are in the hospital for more than 90 days.

Psychiatric hospitals and general hospitals have the same out-of-pocket costs. After you meet your Part A deductible (\$1,676 in 2025), Part A will pay the full costs of the first 60 days of inpatient care in a benefit period. A benefit period begins when you are admitted to the hospital as an inpatient and continues until you have been out of the hospital or a skilled nursing facility for 60 days in a row. After day 60, you will have to pay \$419 per day to the hospital (in 2025). If you are using your lifetime reserve days, you will need to pay \$838 per day to the hospital (in 2025).

Finally, if you or someone you know is in crisis, call or text 988 or use the chat function at 988lifeline.org. Call 911 if you're in an immediate medical crisis.

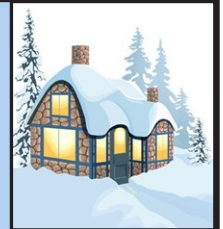

**Home Delivered Meal Participants:**

We are still at the time of year when bad weather may prevent us from delivering your meal. We try very hard to deliver despite the weather. Please be patient with our drivers as delays may happen. Every now and then a storm is too much for even our most courageous drivers. In winter, we may have high snowdrifts and icy roads. To ensure delivery of your meals, please arrange to have your sidewalk and driveway shoveled by the time of delivery. Our drivers cannot deliver unless your walkways and driveways are free from snow and ice.



This year we will follow the same plan we did last year. We cannot solely rely on school closings to alert us as some may be virtual or on a holiday break. The Aging and Disability Resource Center of Buffalo and Pepin Counties will be making the decision on whether home-delivered meals will be delivered. We will base this decision on input from meteorologists and local County Highway personnel, along with if there are various school closings in Buffalo and Pepin Counties. Unfortunately, we will not be able to call everyone individually to inform them of the sites closing. **Please check WEAU 13 News and News 8 Now for posted closures during inclement weather.**

Also, please remember that meals may tend to arrive a little later in winter months because of uncertain road conditions. Your patience is greatly appreciated. If your meal is more than 45 minutes past its normal delivery time, please call your meal site.

Be sure to fill your cupboard and freezer with your favorite "emergency" foods for the winter months. Canned soups, fruits and vegetables, and other easy to prepare items are some ideas for you. We will try to always remind you the day before if we think we may need to close due to weather.
